# **Lighting of the Advent Wreath — Mary Nagrani**

We have already lit the first two candles on the Advent Wreath, one for hope and one for peace. Today we light the third candle, the candle of joy. Joy is like an underground spring that wells up within us, but joy is also a choice, an attitude.

In Romans 15:13, the apostle Paul prays for his readers: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." So today we open ourselves to joy, trusting that God has already planted it in us.
